He was ordained a Minister in the Apostolic Church in West Fliciana Parish, in Louisiana. The church we were in was located in Harvey, Louisiana. He became affiliated with the Church of God Apostolic in 1986 when he came to Greensboro, N. C. He was an Associate Minister with Bishop C. O. Reid at Wings of Healing in Greensboro, N. C. He served as Associate Pastor and Youth while at the New Beginnings Christian Development Center, Lexington, N.C. He has served as the Church Bible
