It was food that was needed for the starving people that she was caring for. But when she got up to the cashier, she said that she was not going to move out of line until the people behind her came up with the money to pay for the food. Her request was granted.

Certainly, Mother Teresa was a **person of influence par excellence**. People who make the biggest difference in this world are people who are driven by a passion. **You only have to say their name-and everybody knows**.
