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THE MAGNIFICAT: MARY'S SONG TEN KEYS TO AFFECT GENERATIONS

THE PROPER RESPONSE FOR 2025 "BE IT UNTO ME ACCORDING TO THY WORD"

A THREE-PART SONG:

- (1) In the first part Mary praises God for what He had done for herself, (vv. 46-50).
- (2) In the second, she praises Him for what He had done, and would do, against the oppressors of His people, (vv. 51-53).
- (3) In the third, she praises Him for what He had done and would do, for His Church, (vv. 53-56).

Vs. 46 AND MARY SAID, MY SOUL DOTH MAGNIFY THE LORD

- 1.) <u>A Recipient of His Goodness:</u> Mary's song is a counterpart of the song of Hannah, as related in 1 Sam. 2:1-10. Both women sang as a response to the goodness of the Lord. Hannah and Mary's experience is a reminder that If we remain patient and pure, God will give us our own victory song. So, start rehearsing!
- 2.) <u>A Time to Celebrate God's Acts:</u> Note some of the lyrics; "My soul doth magnify the Lord." The verb signifies "to celebrate with words, to extol with praises." This is the only way in which God can be magnified or made great. Strictly speaking, nothing can be added to God, for He is infinite and eternal. Therefore, the way to magnify Him is to show forth and celebrate those acts in which He has manifested His greatness.

Vs. 47 AND MY SPIRIT HATH REJOICED IN GOD MY SAVIOUR.

3.) *Exalting with Understanding:* "My spirit hath rejoiced in God my Savior" (v.47). These words forcefully show that

Mary's whole soul was filled with the divine influence and wrapped up in God. She called the one she exalted the "God my Savior." Acknowledging her personal need of salvation and fully understanding that that salvation comes only from God, exhibited in the person of Jesus, and ratified through His name (Acts 4:12).

GLORIFYING FORCEFULLY!

- Vehemently Convincingly Compellingly
- Persuasively Powerfully Weightily

Vs. 48 FOR HE HATH REGARDED THE LOW ESTATE OF HIS HANDMAIDEN: FOR, BEHOLD, FROM HENCEFORTH ALL GENERATIONS SHALL CALL ME BLESSED.

4.) A Call to Humility: "He hath regarded the low estate of his handmaiden" (v.48). In the Lord's loving manner He has "Looked favorably," and visited me in my humiliation. God resists the proud but gives grace to the humble (1 Pet.5:5).

From henceforth all generations shall call me blessed. This was the character by which Mary wished to be known by all generations - "A blessed or fully satisfied happy virgin." A title ascribed by Jesus for all who are a part of his kingdom.

To be addressed as "Queen of Heaven," would have been of no interest to Mary, who considered herself the Lord's handmaiden. We dishonor ourselves and others, when we applied titles that are both absurd and blasphemous.

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Vs. 49 FOR HE THAT IS MIGHTY HATH DONE TO ME GREAT THINGS; AND HOLY IS HIS NAME.

5.) <u>To Expect the Miraculous:</u> "He that is mighty hath done to me great things (or "miracles), and Holy is his name (v.49). Mary testified that the mighty God had given her personally, abundant goodness and exuberant kindness.

We should expect the same when we submit to his will and reference the chase and holy name Jesus? This agrees with the following clause. Vs. 50 And his mercy is on them that fear him from generation to generation.
