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The Other Side of Leadership

Scripture text: Joshua 5:13-15 / Matthew 6:10 (KJV)

Objective: To highlight the importance of praying and walking out the Lord's Prayer – "Thy will be done," through Joshua's life experience.

I. Joshua Call to Leadership (Joshua 1:2)

- A. He was promised the possession of the land (v. 3-5)
- B. He was assured divine authority (v.5)
- C. He was given an affirmation of divine faithfulness (v.5)
- D. Four times he was commanded to be **strong** and **courageous** (vs. 6,7,9,18).
 - a. This was his responsibility

II. Joshua In Leadership

- A. Joshua was alone, prayerfully contemplating the next step
- B. The sudden appearance of "a man with his sword drawn in his hand."
- C. **Gilgal** ("a wheel"- "rollaway") is a place where leaders come to grips with true leadership.
- D. Joshua challenged him

III. The Challenge – "Are you for us or against us?

- A. Joshua (as some leaders), only knew two sides, "for" and "against."
- B. When the warrior announces "neither!" Joshua is to learn that there is another side to successful leadership.
- C. Why did the warrior not choose for or against?

IV. Examining the Two Options:

1. If he is for you?

- A. We would judge ourselves too lightly
- B. We would lean towards **Pride** Pride of **grace**, pride of **race**, and the pride of **place**
- C. We would have the tendency to act on our own—("become cocky") and lose sight of the big picture
- D. **We will reject some necessary correction—**like Peter, feel free to challenge God (Matthew 16:22 24)

2. If he is "against me?"

- A. We would judge ourselves to harshly
- B. We would become disappointed, and discourage, and lose hope and faith in the face of difficulties
- C. We would fail to see the goodness of God in the land of the living
- D. Life would be a hopeless venture
- E. Motivation to strive forward would come to a grinding halt
- 3. Middle-of-the-road "yield" and "Submit"
 - A. In this, "we judge Him faithful that promised" (Heb. 11:11)
 - B. We have no agenda but His (Matt.6:10)
 - C. Our lives, are, swallowed up in His life (Gal.2:20)
- IV. Choosing the right position—" And Joshua did so."
 - A. You have the man with a drawn sword in his hand (Josh.5:13)
 - B. The ground in his presence become holy ground—no shoes needed
 - C. Where Jesus becomes our superior officer our ruling King
 - D. **Your prayer is:** "Your kingdom come, Your will be done in earth, as it is in heaven... For Yours is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen (Matt.6:10,13)
 - D. Where worship is the agenda and the position is face down to the ground (Rev. 5:11-14)
